

Secondary School place, how to accept or decline



Today the secondary school choices for the year 6 children have come out.

All parents are required to accept or decline the school place they have been offered by the stated deadline using the Parent Portal.

Parent Portal(opens new window)

If you have applied for a school place using the Parent Portal then you will need to log back into the portal and select one of the following options:

- Accept offer Accepts the place offered
- Hold this place while I pursue Waiting List / Appeal options If you do not want to accept
 the offered place because you are choosing to appeal or appeal and go on the waiting list for
 one of your higher preferences, use this option

• I no longer require a school place - Only use this option if you wish the whole application to be completely withdrawn. You will be asked to confirm why the place is no longer required


1-1 sessions


